<p>Language Development</p> <p>Knows first and last name Points to named body parts Follows simple directions Asks and answers questions Talks with others Points to named colors Knows use of common objects Uses 3 word sentences</p>	<p>Social Skills</p> <p>Plays with 1 or 2 preferred playmates Asks to play with other children Seeks adult help to resolve social problems Takes turns Follows home and school routines and rules with reminders</p>
<p>Fine Motor</p> <p>Uses eating utensils Scribbles lines, circles, and zigzags Able to snip with scissors Stacks 10 blocks Grips drawing and writing tools with whole hand Squeezes, snips, strings, pours water</p>	<p>Gross Motor</p> <p>Throws a ball Maintains balance Runs Avoids obstacles and people Walks up and down stairs Rides tricycle, may push with feet Jumps</p>
<p>Reading Readiness</p> <p>Listens to stories Turns pages from front to back Recognizes first letter in name Names pictures in a book Notices some words start with the same letter</p>	<p>Math Readiness</p> <p>Verbally counts to 5 Counts and points to 5 objects Identifies basic shapes (circle, square and triangle) Simple comparisons between objects</p>
